



SNOW REMOVAL

PROCEDURE

Property owners – commercial and residential – are responsible for the public space around their properties. Charter schools should be sure to adhere to the D.C. law regarding snow removal.

This means keeping the space free of trash, litter, and debris, as well as snow and ice, cleared from sidewalks, handicap ramps and steps on their property within the first eight (8) daylight hours after the snow, sleet or ice stops falling.

When a snow emergency is declared all vehicles must be moved immediately from D.C. Snow Emergency Routes which are marked with red and white signs. Parking is banned on these routes to allow thorough salting and plowing. In the District, illegally parked vehicles are subject to a \$250 fine plus additional fees for towing and storage at an impoundment lot.
