PROPOSAL

Breakthrough Montessori Public Charter School submits to the DC Public Charter School Board this application to amend its charter agreement by changing the item(s) selected above. If approved, this amendment will be effective on 28 August, 2018.

1. Please provide details on the selected amendment(s) above and describe the requested change(s), including the school's rationale for the proposed changes. Describe any planning that is already underway to prepare for the proposed amendment.

Next year, we intend to have three classrooms to serve our – as of now – 45 first grade students, making for a faculty to student ratio of 1:15. To be in alignment with best Montessori practice, we would like to have two adults dedicated to each classroom. However, our budget now only allows us to have a campus-wide floating staff member whose attention may be called to other classrooms occasionally. By increasing the ratio to 17:1 (and thereby increasing enrollment for next year by six students), we can afford to hire dedicated aides for each class, dramatically improving on the conditions for the students and the classroom teachers. Moreover, it allows us to serve six more students from our waitlist. Presently, 26 families are waiting for a first-grade placement.

2. How will the proposed amendment(s) support or enhance the school's mission?

First, it delivers a better experience for students (more adult support), and the teacher (more hands to help in a classroom where students are self-paced). Secondly, it helps us deliver on our equity principles by opening our doors to a larger cadre of students who may or may not have benefitted from Montessori pedagogy previously.

We had a minor notice of concern relative to the number of board members we had – we had an even number when it was required to be odd. We promptly added a new board member and brought ourselves into compliance.

Next year, because of the need to take on some debt to open our new facility, we operate at a slight loss for the year. Our budget as submitted was for an

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income to debt ratio of 1.42. With the proposed changes, our position improves next year, moving our ratio to 1.52. We return to profitability in 2019-2020, and this change is projected to marginally increase profit in that year, too. Please see our attached five year budget projections.

The administrative team took a unanimous vote in support of the amendment, and so we posed the question to our faculty – both current and those we'd newly hired for next year. All supported the change, as they felt it was important to give our first-graders dedicated aides. We then took the suggestion to our board, and to a few parents. The board unanimously supported the amendment in a 7-0 vote (minutes are attached), and no parents have yet expressed opposition.
