SUMMARY: The District of Columbia Public Charter School Board (“PCSB”) announces an opportunity for the public to submit comment on a request submitted by The Family Place Public Charter School (“The Family Place PCS”) to locate at 3309 16th St. NW, Washington, DC 20010.

The Family Place PCS received conditional approval to operate a new public charter school on May 22, 2017. Its mission is to “improve the literacy and workplace skills of low-income limited English proficient adults in the District so that they and their family are self-sustaining, employable and engaged in their community.” Pending its full charter approval, The Family Place PCS will open in school year 2018-2019 and serve adult students aged 18 and over.
