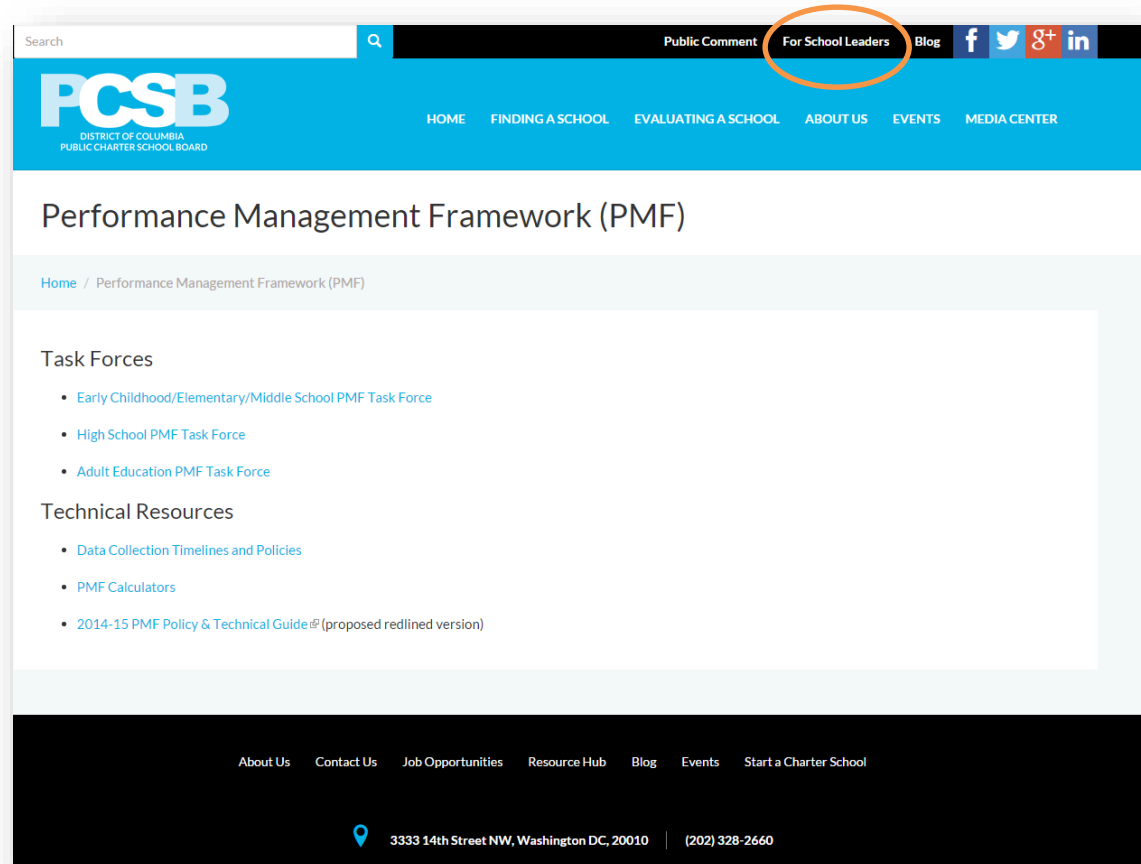
PMF Wiki transitioning to PCSB website

Career Readiness Floors & Targets Proposal

Career Readiness measure quick reminders

- This is an optional measure
- Schools may opt into the measure by the August 31 deadline annually
- Two components:
 1. CTE program of study completer rate
 2. CTE certification rate
- The measure is two points on the HS PMF
 - For schools opting in, College Readiness is reduced to three points

How did we come up with the proposal?

- Interested HS PMF task force members (and others) formed the HS PMF CTE working group
- Group member shared current work around CTE programs and where they would like to go with CTE programs
- We looked at available CTE data from OSSE

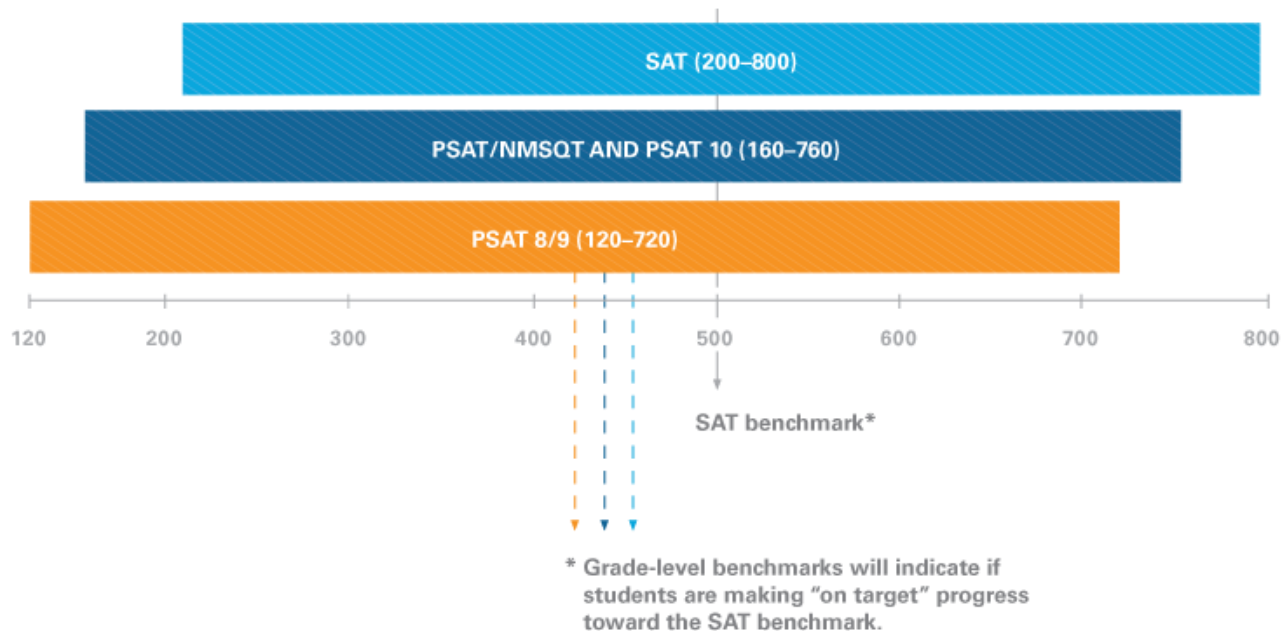
The Redesigned SAT/PSAT and the HS PMF

The Redesigned SAT and PSAT

- College Board is rolling out the Redesigned SAT in March 2016 and PSAT in October 2015
- Eight key content changes:
 1. Words in Context
 2. Command of Evidence
 3. Essay Analyzing a Source
 4. Math that Matters Most
 5. Problems Grounded in Real-World Contexts
 6. Analysis in Science and in History/Social Studies
 7. Great Global Conversations and U.S. Founding Documents
 8. No Penalty for Guessing

The Redesigned SAT and PSAT

- Redesigned SAT and PSAT will use a common score scale

Updating SAT and PSAT on HS PMF

- College Board plans to release concordance tables from the current tests to the redesigned tests:
 - Redesigned PSAT to pre-2015 PSAT: December 2015
 - Redesigned SAT to current SAT: May 2016
- Our plan: Use these concordance tables to map the new scores to their equivalent scores of 80 for PSAT and 800 for SAT
- No adjustment is needed to the floors and targets

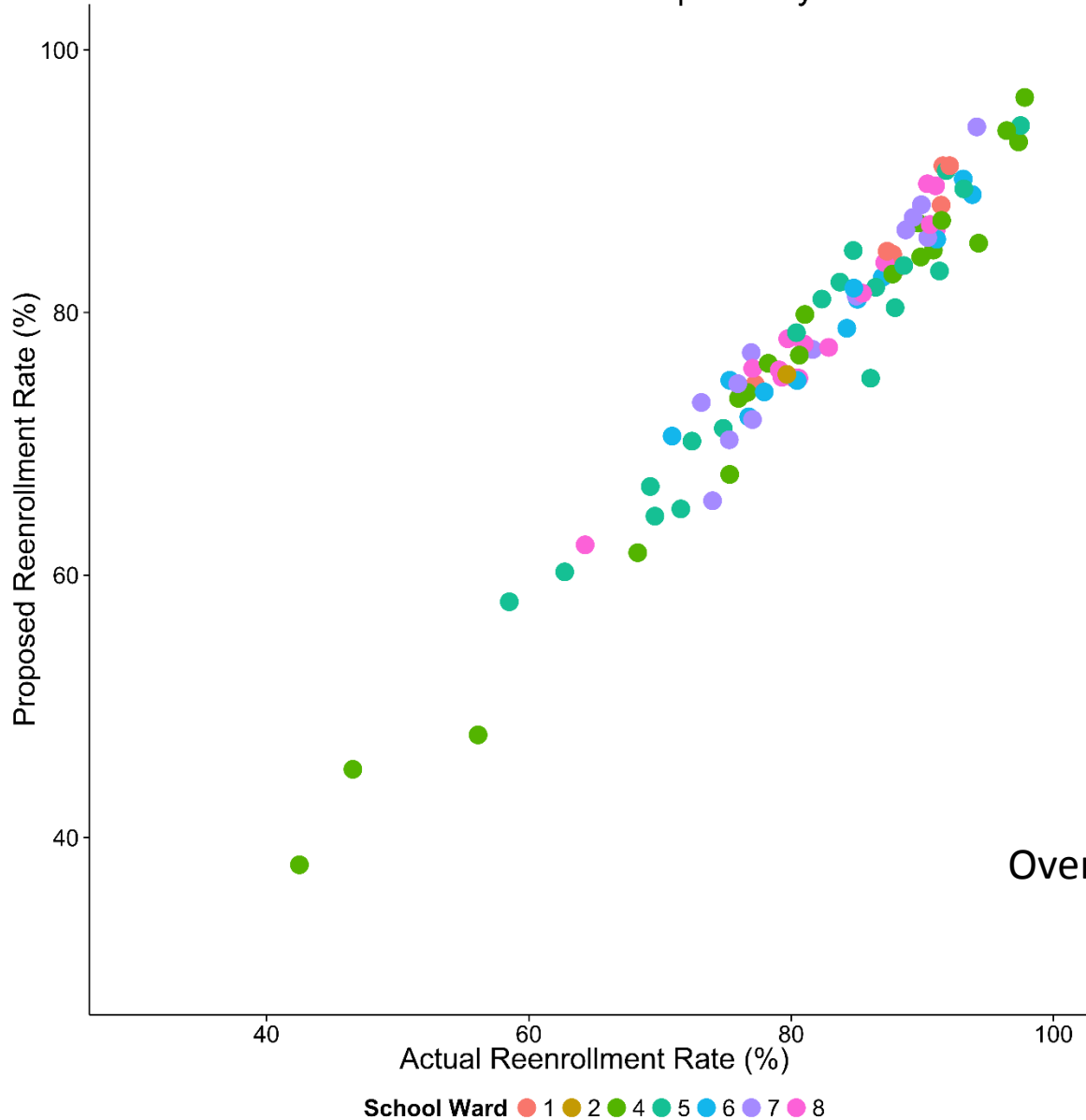
Re-enrollment Proposal

Easing the burden of re-enrollment

- PCSB recognizes that collecting documentation for re-enrollment is burdensome
- PCSB proposes to calculate re-enrollment by using a “true” re-enrollment rate with an adjusted target based on the 90th percentile
 - Only students who are in a terminal grade, who have graduated, or who have passed away are ineligible
 - Schools would NOT submit any documentation

Proposed Change by Ward

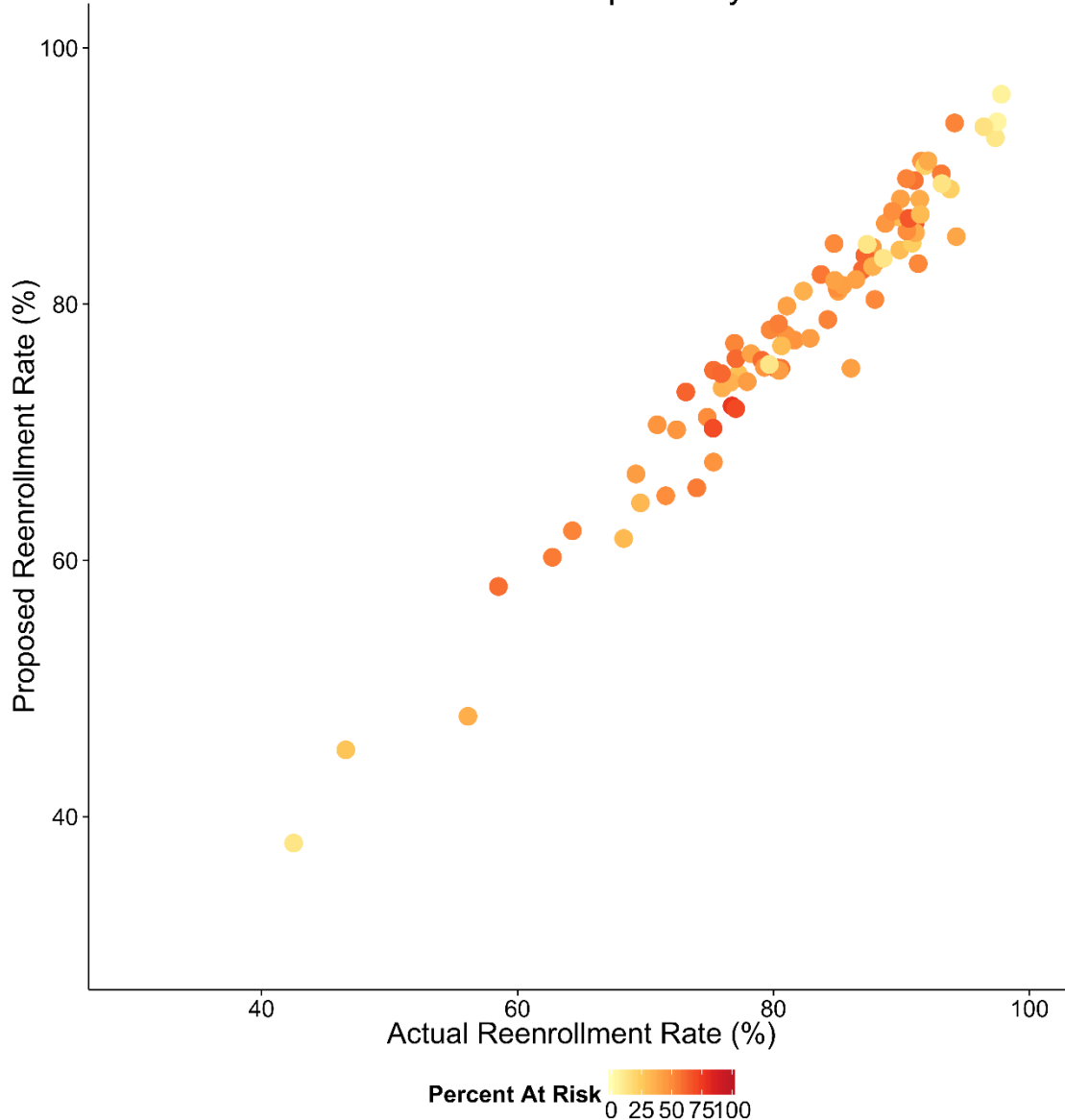
Reenrollment Rates Compared by Ward

What is the Impact?

2014-15 Floor	2014-15 Target

Floor and target with new re-enrollment proposal

Percentile	2012-13	2013-14	2015-16	3-Year Weighted Average
10 th	60.6	64.6	64.9	64.0%
90 th	88.4	88.9	89.9	89.3%

When would any change take effect?

- Potential change for 2015-16 with 66% of vote
 - If not, PCSB will work with the task forces on this issues for the 2016-17 PMF
- PCSB will return to our schedule of making changes in the winter and spring task force meetings

Publishing the 2014-15 HS PMF

Will PCSB publish a 2014-15 HS PMF?

Yes, unless the following occurs:

(As approved by the Board last fall)

- The framework is not ready for public release on or before January 19, 2016
- There is a low correlation (< 0.70) between DC CAS-related achievement points earned and PARCC-related achievement points earned
- PARCC releases a study showing that the test results are invalid for all students or a subgroup of students

Will PCSB publish a 2014-15 HS PMF?

(Continued)

- PARCC releases consortium-level analysis that there is a significant difference between the paper- and computer-based administrations
- There is a catastrophic event that makes PCSB believe that it would be inappropriate to apply the PARCC results to schools

What if MGP is not valid?

(As approved by the Board last fall)

If the High School Transitional MGP is found to be invalid, PCSB will use the following logic:

- Overall PMF score out of 92.5 points if only one MGP (either math or ELA) is found to be invalid
- Overall PMF score out of 85 points if neither MGP is valid

Will high schools be tiered for 2014-15?

- Schools will be labeled Tier 1 or Tier 2
- No school will be labeled Tier 3 for the 2014-15 school year due to the change in state assessments
- Scores will be displayed for all schools
