



Notice of Revisions to DC PCSB Policy:
Revisions to Transcript Audit Policy

ACTION: Open for Public Comment

PUBLIC COMMENT ACCEPTED UNTIL: **March 19, 2018**

SUMMARY: The District of Columbia Public Charter School Board ("DC PCSB") announces an opportunity for the public to submit comment on Revisions to the Transcript Audit Policy from February 7 to March 19, 2018.

This policy explains the process by which DC PCSB verifies the status of 9th grade students, to ensure they are on track to graduate in four years (one of the indicators measured in the Performance Management Framework) as well as the graduate status of 12th grade students to ensure they are on track to be included on the certified graduates list. Revisions to the policy include the addition of an attendance review during DC PCSB's transcript audit and a guidance document explaining specifics of the audit (including timeline, documents reviewed, and follow up to schools).
