



Adult students learn English as a Second Language (ESL), digital literacy, and parenting. Adults in the most advanced ESL levels may enroll in a high school diploma program. Briya provides workforce training to obtain credentials as a Child Development Associate or Medical Assistant. Briya's PK program provides dual language learners with a project-based education that promotes their development and knowledge in many areas. Briya has received recognition at the state and national levels for its outstanding teachers and parents.
