#### CALVIN:

Greeting and well wishes to team and family. Commendation to faculty and staff on care and creativity of students. Situation provides an opportunity for innovation.

#### JUSTIN:

- Distributed computers to all students 2 weeks earlier. Began virtual learning 9 days ago.
- Highlight: some non-engaged students have actually engaged more digitally-distanced and some teachers with classroom challenges embraced virtual teaching.
- Informed board how team's day is structured and when instruction takes place. Have prioritized socio-emotional status of students.
- 90% students online, hotspots being dropped off to remaining students
- Based on survey, the team gave 4.5/5 on IDEA's COVID-19 response.
- Acknowledgment, thanks and well wishes from all to Joanne Fort who is stepping down after 8 years of service to the Board of Trustees
- Still want to give students scholarships for college and encouraged board to donate.

### KELLY (Finances):

- finances looking as expected. Number of students and expenditures looks promising. Virtual learning improves budget forecasts.
- Question from Calvin:how much emergency funds will become available to the school?
   Will receive in April: \$108/student, money promised from deficit
   Educational Equity Fund: ordering 20 tablets wifi enabled

- Calvin: fire up fundraising activities Kelly:discretionary funds less available during this crisis
- Lower interest rates create opportunity to refinance

# TIFFINI (Academic Excellence)

- Data from principal is prior to COVID 19. Great intervention for 9th grade on track. 9-12th grades average 80% engagement.
- Partnering with Enriched to provide virtual support to students with disabilities.
- SAT scores increased year over year
- Career and Technical Education: 17 certifications expected,25 dual enrollment:expected
- IDEA as a feeding location during COVID
