

SUMMARY: The District of Columbia Public Charter School Board (DC PCSB) announces an opportunity for the public to submit comments on the DC public charter schools listed below, which are up for a charter review on October 17, 2022. Pending DC PCSB staff's analysis, the Board may elect to do one of the following for each school: 1) continue the school's charter without conditions, 2) conditionally continue the school's charter by imposing annual or interim targets or requirements it must meet, or 3) commence charter revocation proceedings.

1. <u>Elsie Whitlow Stokes Community Freedom Public Charter School (EW Stokes</u> <u>PCS)</u>:

EW Stokes PCS is up for its 25-year charter review. The school operates two campuses in Wards 5 and 7 where it serves students in grades pre-kindergarten 3 (PK3) – 5. Its mission is to "prepare culturally diverse elementary school students in the District of Columbia to become leaders, scholars and responsible citizens who are committed to social justice."

2. <u>Sela Public Charter School (Sela PCS):</u>

Sela PCS is up for its 10-year charter review. The school operates a single campus in Ward 4 where it serves students in grades PK3 – 5. Its mission is to "offer children of all ethnic and socioeconomic backgrounds in the District of Columbia, from pre-kindergarten to 5th grade, the opportunity to achieve academic excellence in a safe, nurturing environment that focuses on Hebrew language immersion, promotes the value of diversity and provides the skills for taking action in the world."

3. <u>Statesmen College Preparatory Academy for Boys Public Charter School</u> (<u>Statesmen PCS</u>)

Statesmen PCS is up for its five-year charter review. The school operates a single campus in Ward 8 where it serves students in grades 4 – 8. Its mission is to "create a boy-friendly pedagogy-informed academic environment within which young men are equipped with the academic skills, social competencies, and personal development necessary to navigate life challenges, attend and complete the college of their choice, and return to become the premier agents of social change within and for the communities they serve."

Pursuant to the School Reform Act, D.C. Code 38-1802 et seq., DC PCSB is required to review each DC public charter school's performance at least once every five years.

PUBLIC MEETING: DC PCSB will discuss and vote on EW Stokes PCS, Sela PCS, and Statesmen PCS's charter review on October 17, 2022, at 6:00 pm. Please check <u>www.dcpcsb.org</u> to register to attend the meeting.
