Founded in 2000, Capital City offers a rigorous, engaging program through the EL Education model to students in grades PK-12. Students participate in learning expeditions: long-term, in-depth investigations of compelling topics with authentic research, fieldwork, and service, resulting in high-quality products. A whole child approach incorporates a dynamic social curriculum, creative arts integration, and fitness/wellness programs. Capital City has an inclusive, diverse environment, including low student-teacher ratios and instruction tailored to individualized learning. AP course offerings and comprehensive, ongoing college counseling are provided to all students while in high school and through our alumni outreach program. A robust array of after-school activities includes competitive sports and arts programs. The entire school is located in a renovated facility with a full gym, library, garden, athletic fields, Makerspace, and theater.
