

#### A Note from the School

Early Childhood Academy Public Charter School (ECA) is fully accredited by the Middle States Commissions on Elementary and Secondary Schools. ECA students participate in general music, Spanish, and physical education, in addition to all core subjects. Children have full use of technological devices (tablets, iPads, Smart Boards and laptops) within the classroom, and participate in regular field trip activities to connect classroom learning with real-world experiences. ECA students learn to play the violin, viola, cello, xylophone, and percussion instruments.
