Friendship underwent a 20-year charter review in March 2018 and was deemed as meeting its goals and academic achievement expectations. For SY 2018-19, six campuses achieved Tier 1 status, and one high school campus (Friendship Tech Prep) ranked in the Top 5 for charter high schools PMF performance. This is significant due to the higher proportion of Friendship students classified as atrisk compared to other Tier 1 high schools.

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PROPOSAL

Friendship PCS submits to the DC Public Charter School Board this application to amend its charter agreement by changing the item(s) selected above. If approved, this amendment will be effective on July 1, 2019 (leave blank if this has not been determined).

 Please provide details on the selected amendment(s) above and describe the requested change(s), including the school's rationale for the proposed changes. Describe any planning that is already underway to prepare for the proposed amendment.

Effective June 30, 2020, Achievement Prep Public Charter School is closing its middle school campus located at 908 Wahler Place SE and will not have immediate use for the vacant portion of the facility. Friendship proposes to lease the facility for SY20-21, operating a new middle school campus there for grades 4-8. The new Friendship campus will help meet urgent demand for higher performing middle seats in the area while also providing the additional capacity Friendship needs as it completes the expansion of its nearby Southeast facility for SY21-22. In planning for the proposed amendment, Friendship has secured letters from hundreds of families documenting their intent to apply if Friendship opens the campus, engaged in multiple meetings with families soon to be displaced from the closing middle school, negotiated a lease, brought in its middle school leaders to assess the needs of middle school students in the area, secured a strong transformative campus leader and begun the necessary curriculum, assessment, culture, operations and other planning necessary.

2. How will the proposed amendment(s) support or enhance the school's mission?

Friendship was founded to ensure that students receive a world-class education and become ethical, literate, well rounded, and self-sufficient citizens who contribute actively to their communities. As such, we are working to ensure that urgent demand for high quality middle school seats is met and that students receive a world-class education in accordance with our mission. We have the capacity to serve additional middle school students and our enrollment ceiling can accommodate them.

Since SY 2016-17, Friendship PCS has been 100% compliant according to PCSB's Annual Compliance Review and has received no board actions. In 2017, in response to an anonymous complaint the PCSB audited discipline data for discipline reporting and also audited data related to disproportionate suspensions. The PCSB found that all discipline data was accurately reported and that there was one attendance error (a student incorrectly coded). DC PCSB staff closed both audits and determined that no corrective action was necessary.

To operate the new campus at Wahler Place the cost is approximately \$20,000 per student and is in keeping with per pupil funding from local and federal funds. Friendship anticipates no additional expenses beyond the per pupil cost to operate at this location.

Friendship has discussed the proposed new campus with families, school staff and leaders who would potentially be impacted. The Friendship school community has expressed support of the decision to ensure middle school students, especially those who may be displaced from an impending closure, have access to a Friendship campus. Friendship has also participated with Achievement Prep in the Special Board Meeting it held publicly on the closing of its middle school campus and the possibility that Friendship would open a campus in the same location. The meeting was well attended and parents expressed concerns about the school closing in general; however, they also expressed support for a Friendship campus at the location. The parents also received a letter from Shantelle Wright, Founder and CEO of Achievement Prep, and Friendship has been onsite to provide information and answer questions about our programming. Friendship began outreach to the ANC at our nearby Southeast campus and the ANC covering the Wahler Place location. The ANC was formally notified on February 14, 2020.

6. When did your school's board approve the proposed amendment(s)? Please attach minutes from the meeting and vote results.

Friendship Trustees were informed of the proposed new campus on January 27, 2020 and expressed support for Friendship to proceed. The Executive Committee of the Friendship Board met February 3, 2020 and February 10, 2020 to discuss operating a campus at 908 Wahler Place and the options for doing so. During the February 3, 2020 discussion, the Committee voted to approve the development of a Memorandum of Understanding with Achievement Prep for the campus location. On February 14, 2020, the Committee voted to approve the proposed amendment to open a new campus at 908 Wahler Place for grades 4 to 8 for school year 2020-21. If DC PCSB approves the request, the FPCS BOT will ratify the Committee's vote. Friendship PCS is keeping the PMF as its goals for all campuses, including this new campus.
