



Academy of Hope Adult Public Charter School Non-Discrimination Policy

Pursuant to the SRA, § 38-1802.06, as amended, enrollment Academy of Hope Adult Public Charter School is open to all students who are residents of the District of Columbia, and if space is available, to non-resident students who pay tuition at the rate established by the Office of the State Superintendent of Education. Academy of Hope Adult Public Charter School does not limit enrollment based on a student's race, color, religion, national origin, language spoken, or intellectual or athletic ability. In addition, Academy of Hope Adult Public Charter School does not limit enrollment based on a student's sexual orientation or gender identification.

Which programs are you interested in?  High School Diploma - (SUMMER OR FALL TERMS) Academy of Hope offers two paths to earn your high school diploma. Our teachers and student support team will help guide you to the best path. We are currently accepting applications for both the Summer and Fall 2024 terms.  Workforce - Workforce programs are currently accepting applications for Winter/Spring 2025. To qualify for Workforce programs, you must be a high school graduate or have 3 out 4 GED subject tests passed, and at least a "too close to call" score on the GED Ready for the 4th subject and qualifying CASAS scores.
Workforce  Certified Nursing Assistant Training Program (CNA) - AoH's Certified Nurse Aide Training program spans 5 months with 200 hours of classroom and lab sessions, followed by 40 hours of clinical training at healthcare partner sites.  Completion qualifies students to take the NNAAP exam for DC nursing aide licensure. Classes are available in fall and winter/spring with day and evening options. Requirements include a high school diploma or equivalent progress, CASAS Reading score 225+, CASAS Math score 210+, Northstar digital literacy scores in Basic Computer, Basic Internet and Basic email 75%+, onsite advising, a background check, DC-mandated drug screening, and health documentation. "Limited seats. Locations: Ward 5 (Daytime/Evening) and Ward 8 (Daytime) only.  CompTIA A+ - CompTIA A+ is a rigorous 10-month program divided into two five-month "Core" sections covering
hardware, cloud computing, networking, operating systems, security, software troubleshooting, and operational procedures. It requires passing two separate exams to earn the credential. Students can start in either fall or spring with day and evening sessions available, provided they meet requirements such as a high school diploma, CASAS Reading score 235+,CASthat shows basic understanding of computers, and either a CompTIA certification, relevant hands-on experience, or a degree in IT. *Limited seats. Location: Ward 5 Daytime/Ward 8Evening.
OmpTIA IT Fundamentals - CompTIA IT Fundamentals (ITF+) is an introductory certification program covering basic IT concepts like computing networks, operating systems, hardware, security, software development, and databases. The course spans five months with 200+ hours of instruction, including virtual simulations and hands-on experience, preparing students for the ITF+ certification exam. Successful completion of ITF+ qualifies students to advance to CompTIA A+. AoH offers classes in fall and winter with day and evening schedules. Requirements include a high school diploma, CASAS Reading score 235+, CASAS Math score 210+, Northstar digital literacy score 85%+, an onsite advising session, and a passing score on the CompTIA Pretest. *Limited seats. Location: Ward 5 Daytime/Ward 8 Evening.
Medical Billing & Coding - ENROLLMENT WILL BE OPEN AGAIN IN THE FALL 2025. No enrollment for Winter/Spring 2025. AoH's Medical Billing and Coding training program offers comprehensive instruction in converting medical information into universal codes, covering medical terminology, anatomy, physiology, and healthcare documentation intricacies. Graduates are proficient in navigating healthcare billing processes to ensure accurate reimbursement and compliance with regulatory standards. This is a full-year program that runs from fall 2024 to spring 2025, with applications accepted solely for the Fall term. Requirements include a high school diploma or equivalent progress, CASAS Reading score 235+, CASAS Math score 210+, Northstar digital literacy score 85%+, Proof of proficiency in Word, Excel, and MS Suite, Onsite advising session with Workforce staff, and Health documentation (proof of Covid-19 Vaccination).*Limited seats. Location: Ward 5 Evening only.  Phlebotomy Technician Training - AoH's Phlebotomy Training program spans 5 months with 200 hours of classroom
and lab practice. Students learn blood-drawing procedures, patient care, and equipment maintenance under licensed instructors. Upon completion of theory, skills, and clinical requirements, students are eligible to sit for the NHA exam to become Certified Phlebotomy Technicians (CPT). Classes are offered in fall and winter with day and evening options.  Requirements include a high school diploma or equivalent progress, CASAS Reading score 235+, CASAS Math score 210+, Northstar digital literacy score 75%+, Onsite advising session with Workforce staff, Passing a background check and DC-mandated drug screening, and Health documentation (Covid-19, TB and immunization records).*Limited seats. Locations: Ward 5 (Daytime) and Ward 8 (Evening) only for Winter/Spring 2025 term.
Oscurity+-Security+ is a pivotal certification for aspiring information security professionals, focusing on hardware, operating systems, and network security measures. This course prepares students to implement essential security protocols across diverse IT environments, laying a solid foundation for further specialization in the field. AoH offers Security+ classes during the day in both fall and winter terms. Requirements for enrollment include a high school diploma, CASAS Reading score 235+, CASAS Math score 210+, Northstar digital literacy score 85%+, successful completion of the A+

vising session.\*Limited seats. Location: Ward 5 Daytime only.
